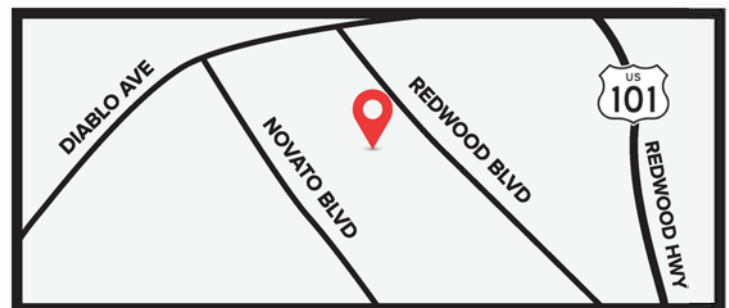
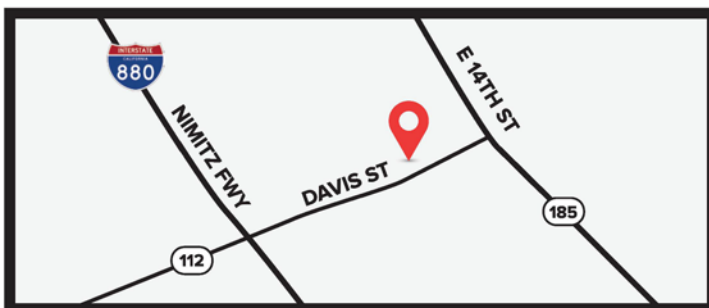

AMERICA'S OLDEST CORVETTE CLUB

In July of 1956 in the East Bay, two Corvette owners, Johnny Zeh and Jerry Wright, waved & stopped to talk. Corvettes were few in numbers then & several weeks could pass before encountering another. These drivers discussed starting a Corvette Club.

By July 15, 1956, an informal meeting of Corvette owners decided to establish the Northern California Corvette Association. These early Corvette owners met frequently at each other's homes with their numbers increasing each month.

On March 28, 1957, an initial group of 35 met at Daily Chevrolet in Oakland to establish the by-laws. By then Josh Hogue, San Francisco Examiner's sports car event columnist suggested that this group combine with the one meeting at Les Vogel Chevrolet in San Francisco.

On **May 9, 1957** NCCA was incorporated & 40 members elected Roy Storey President. Roy was a TV & radio sportscaster & Corvette participant in SCCA's regional races. Sandy Greenblat was elected Vice

President, Patty Gellenbeck, Secretary & John Zeh, Treasurer. The charter membership for NCCA was closed at the end of May 1957 listing 47 members.

President Roy Storey suggested a series of autocross events named after Grand Prix races. NCCA presented Northern California's 3rd autocross. 150 cars drove the course at the Milpitas Ford Plant. This series set the standard for autocrossing in Northern California. Though Roy Storey was soon transferred to Hollywood by CBS, he helped NCCA to properly start as a competing club.

NCCA is still participating in autocrossing, drag races, track racing & car shows. The club is the oldest member of the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC), joining in 1966. We have evolved into more of a social club over the years with the focus on day & weekend trips. In recent years interest has increased in racing, with members taking trophies in drag racing and autocross and entering more and more open track days at Sonoma, Thunderhill, Weather-Tech Raceway at Laguna Seca and Button-willow race tracks.

NCCA celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2007 by inviting past presidents to a dinner dance where we shared memorabilia. Our calendar is filled each January with events for the coming year that include trips to an assortment of locations, car shows, our annual fall banquet, & Christmas party.

The club's signature annual event, **Vette Magic**, has traditionally been a two-day, all Corvette Car Show & Drag Races. It is sponsored and organized by NCCA each summer. In 2015, for the first time, in a major break with tradition, Drag Races for the **40th Vette Magic** were opened to all "Bowtie" (Chevrolet) and then in 2016 for the 41st, to all GM sedans and sports cars. Each year this event draws a large number of Corvette racers and spectators from Northern California & the surrounding states.

NCCA is a valuable member of our community, as we contribute to several charitable organizations each year through our charitable foundation.

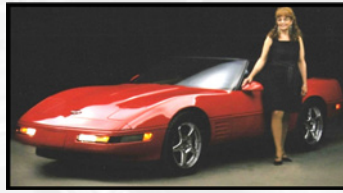


General Business Meeting Minutes

PM



Roll Call of Members - 15 in attendance.

President: Rob Andersen
WSSC: Rob Andersen

Welcome members.

A motion was made to approve the minutes in last month's K and all approved.

Legend's on Display Car Show is a couple months away.
It will be here fast.

Mary is traveling at that time and I might be in a cast and not able to attend or help out.

I will need the board to step up to help out for the show.

George has agreed to help run the show as a backup, if I am not able to attend.

I was concerned about the show and I would really like people/workers to chip in to help out.

Gene will be able to pull the trailer to the event and take it back after all is done.

We are lucky to have Blackhawk allowing us to do our car shows 2 times a year.

We will place the order in Mid March for the awards for the Legends on Display car show.

I contacted Mike Rosenzweig and he helped create the flyer for the car shows. I really appreciate his help! Great job on short notice too.

Blackhawk is promoting both of our car shows.
Per Mary – NorCal corvettes reached out and they want us to send a flyer once they are ready and they will send out to their group.

After the changes are made to the flyers, I will send out to WSSC for their calendar.

Please bring ideas for runs, etc. to our Social Social event.

It was asked if there is a list of runs from the past? - We would

need to look in our old K's to check out runs that have been done in the past that we might want to look into doing again this year.

We can look into the Board having nice shirts or windbreakers which the club can pay for. (Note: If you join as a board member you will get a nice jacket or shirt!) Could be a way to get some new board members and fill the open positions we have.

It is exciting as Legends will be the first car show on the calendar this year

Once we have the flyer updated, I will send out to WSSC for the calendar and also update the club website calendar.

Discussion regarding registration in advance.

We do not have the information on pre-registartion payments for the car shows at this time.

We should look into using Motorsports Reg. (George will check this out and let us know cost etc.)

Scott will look into using the square for payment of registration.

If we go this route for registration, we will have all the paper work done in advance.

We raised the price of the entry fee to the car show by \$5.00 more this year.

Motorsports Reg charges a fee, so since we raised the price we can cover the fees they would normally charge to the entrants for using their payment platform.

We all agreed to raise the price of the car show to \$40 per car.

A motion was made an all approved! We are changing the pricing from \$35 to \$40.

If we go with Motorsports Reg. the fee will be covered by us for the increase in entrance fee.

Mary will update the flyer.

If we do pre registration for the car show, we will have a print out of who registers in advance and can have the paperwork ready for those people in advance.

We have the 2020 National Corvette Museum banner back and we will hang it up at the car show.

We have discussed having people purchase raffle tickets and then drop them into the box in front of the prize.

Per Michelle F. – People are not going to like having to go up to the table to put their raffle tickets into boxes. This could hurt our sales of raffle tickets.

We will get creative on the baskets.

Note: We will store the raffle prizes in the trailer, so that Hal and Madeline do not have to have their living room taken up with all the prizes.

Mary is looking into having the CHP or Danville Police have a booth at the show.

Mary will call TPS about getting some freebies. She will also see about getting some samples from other businesses.

Mary has a donation letter written up and will reach out to see if we can get some free items/samples for the cars that enter the show.

VP Events / VP Motorsports – Mary Coon

I will check with the Blackhawk car museum to see if they have changed the display of vehicles this year. If so, we can set up a run again this year.

I have some information on club apparel – ie: Jackets, Shirts etc. with our club logo. Each member can then choose to purchase a club jacket or shirt. I will look into a few different places (ie: Carleen's Embroidery in San Leandro and another company that the Lodi Corvette club is using for their club jackets. More information to follow.

Mary and Edie DeVine will meet up to discuss sponsorship.

Per Scott and Ken – Do we have a list of trophies we give out? - Yes

Per Rob – we give out 31 trophies.

Mary will update the flyer for both car shows.

The time for judging will reflect 11 am to 1pm.

The time for awards will be 2pm.

The DJ is set for Legend's on Display car show.

Payment to the DJ is already set.

Michelle and George have a possible band that would be willing to play at our events. More information to follow from George. We might be able to use this band at the Vette Magic Car show.

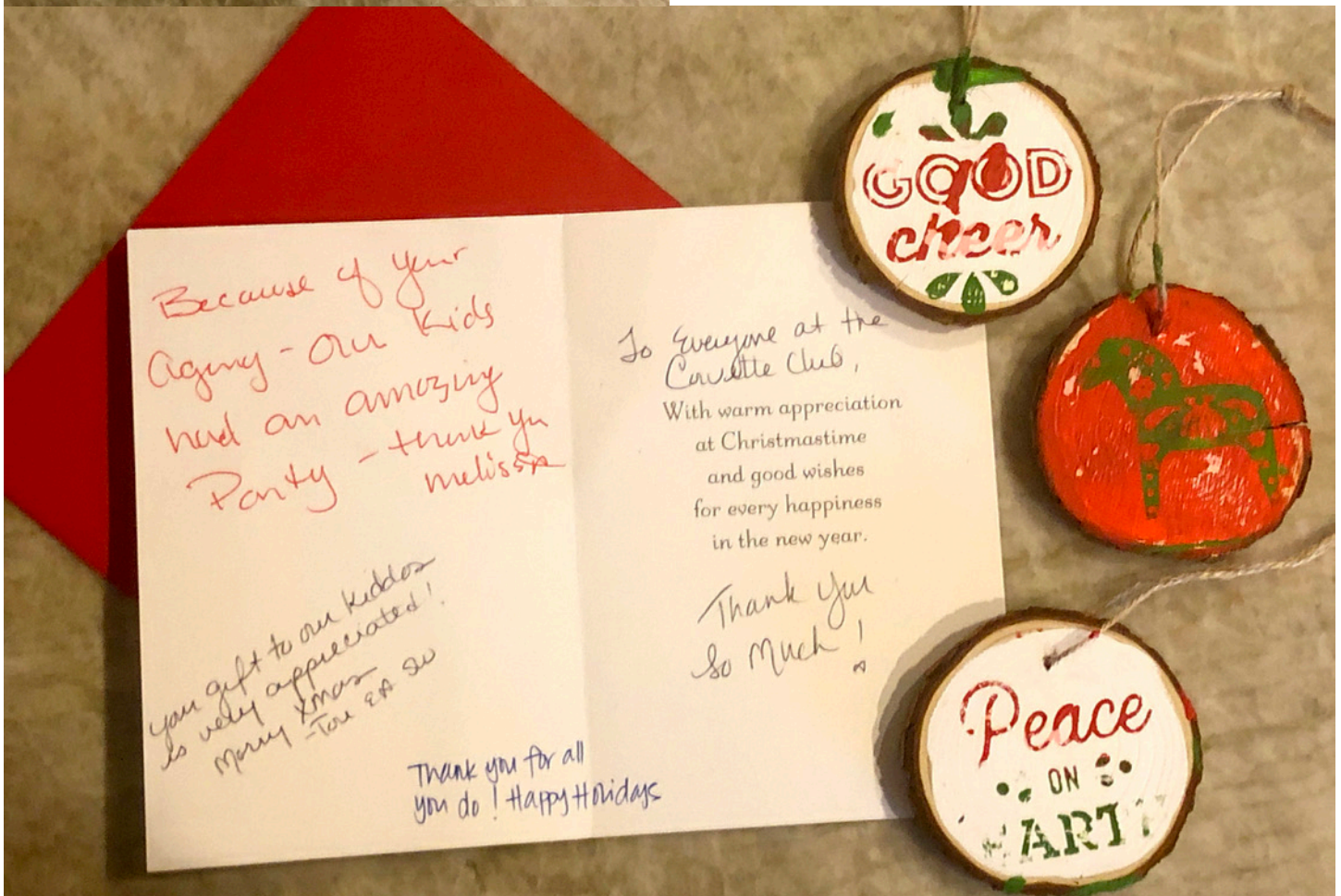




**A Thank You from San Andreas...

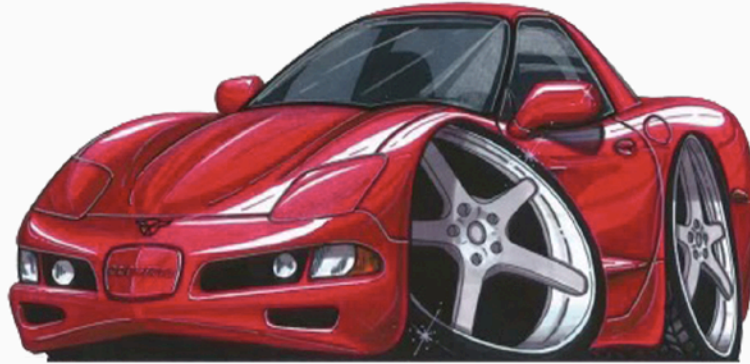

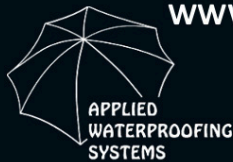
