






America's Oldest Corvette Club

n July of 1956 in the East Bay, two Corvette owners, Johnny Zeh and Jerry Wright, waved & stopped to talk. Corvettes were few in numbers then & several weeks could pass before encountering another. These drivers discussed starting a Corvette Club.

By July 15, 1956, an informal meeting of Corvette owners decided to establish the Northern California Corvette Association. These early Corvette owners met frequently at each other's homes with their numbers increasing each month.

On March 28, 1957, an initial group of 35 met at Daily Chevrolet in Oakland to establish the by-laws. By then Josh Hogue, San Francisco Examiner's sports car event columnist suggested that this group combine with the one meeting at Les Vogel Chevrolet in San Francisco.

n May 9, 1957 NCCA was incorporated & 40 members elected Roy Storey President. Roy was a TV & radio sportscaster & Corvette participant in SCCA's regional races. Sandy Greenblat was elected Vice

President, Patty Gellenbeck, Secretary & John Zeh, Treasurer. The charter membership for NCCA was closed at the end of May 1957 listing 47 members.

President Roy Storey suggested a series of autocross events named after Grand Prix races. NCCA presented Northern California's 3rd autocross. 150 cars drove the course at the Milpitas Ford Plant. This series set the standard for autocrossing in Northern California. Though Roy Storey was soon transferred to Hollywood by CBS, he helped NCCA to properly start as a competing club.

CCA is still participating in autocrossing, drag races, track racing & car shows. The club is the oldest member of the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC), joining in 1966. We have evolved into more of a social club over the years with the focus on day & weekend trips. In recent years interest has increased in racing, with members taking trophies in drag racing and autocross and entering more and more open track days at Sonoma, Thunderhill, Weather-Tech Raceway at Laguna Seca and Button-willow race tracks.

CCA celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2007 by inviting past presidents to a dinner dance where we shared memorabilia. Our calendar is filled each January with events for the coming year that include trips to an assortment of locations, car shows, our annual fall banquet, & Christmas party.

he club's signature annual event, *Vette Magic*, has traditionally been a two-day, all Corvette Car Show & Drag Races. It is sponsored and organized by NCCA each summer. In 2015, for the first time, in a major break with tradition, Drag Races for the *40th Vette Magic* were opened to all "Bowtie" (Chevrolet) and then in 2016 for the 41st, to all GM sedans and sports cars. Each year this event draws a large number of Corvette racers and spectators from Northern California & the surrounding states.

CCA is a valuable member of our community, as we contribute to several charitable organizations each year through our charitable foundation.

General Business Meeting Minutes Shirley Smith, Secretary

Wednesday, April 6, 2022 7:00 pm at Harry's Hof Brau, San Leandro

Call meeting to order at 7:00 PM

Roll Call of Members - 14 in attendance.



President: Rob Andersen – No report – Out due to surgery on his foot. **WSCC: Rob Andersen** – Report made by Mary Coon

VP Events – Mary Coon – President Pro Tiem Welcome members.

A motion was made to approve the minutes in last month's K and all approved.

We have one guest this evening – Billy Roth with a C8 - 2020 Red corvette. Welcome.

First order of business – Update on WSCC Insurance issues – Mary & Ken Coon

Update from WSCC – They have lost their insurance. They have found a company that will offer insurance to them. I have sent an update out to all board members for review. WSCC held another emergency meeting a few nights ago, regarding the insurance issue.

At the last meeting there was a lot of resistance from the clubs. A wheels turning event/run is not covered by the insurance company. This created a lot of problems with the clubs in WSCC.

WSCC went back to the insurance company to re-negotiate and now the insurance company is going to allow caravans/runs but they have to be designated by each club and communicated in advance to WSCC with a \$200 fee per event to be paid by the host club that is liable. Not the person posting the event. (ie: Steve Ledson - Ledson Winery)

We may be required to collect signed disclaimers stating that event is not covered by WSCC Insurance.

On our club calendar for this year, we have six (6) events that are going to require us to pay the \$200 fee. If we ask other clubs to join us on a run we can ask them to share the cost of the \$200 fee.

Legend's on Display car show is a wheels turning event. We will need to have a 1 day insurance policy for this event. WSCC has agreed to reimburse us for the fee for this event only.

Our Meetings, Social Social and Fall Banquet do not need the extra fee to be paid.

We are looking into securing our own insurance for the club. The New proposed policy from WSCC will run from April 2022 to April 2023. We may stick with WSCC insurance for the rest of the year.

Gene Peters mentioned NCCC insurance as they are national and we could look into going with them. (Note: Per Mary - Rob Andersen has looked into this insurance and at this time we will not pursue).

Other clubs are getting their own insurance bids, but they don't cover a wheels turning event. They were told something different at first and then the company changed up what they were saying. They now have an attorney involved.

We have to get back with WSCC this week. We need to give them an answer. E-Board members have been sent all the information by email and I have asked any board members who could not attend tonight's meeting to vote via email. We have enough board members here tonight to take an in person vote.

WSCC has been turned away from insurance companies; they are being blacklisted because of a claim where an individual was killed at an autocross event.

Currently we have 2 car shows for this year.

Ledson Winery event will be hosted by Steve Ledson – Owner of Ledson Winery. We will not have to pay for the fee for this event. Steve Ledson will be inviting corvette owners to join him for a fun day at the Castle.

Harvey Grasso – Wants us to look into NCCC insurance. He wants to know if we have got an application from them? Mary told him no we have not.

We do not have to make a commitment to WSCC in December of 2022 when dues are being paid to them. If we decide not to go with the WSCC insurance for the following year then we will back out of WSCC.

One (1) issue is the E Board D&O insurance (Directos and Officers). It is currently paid thru October of 2022 thru WSCC. If we do not renew with WSCC we will need to get our own D&O insurance policy. Cost to be determined at a later date. The club will have to pay for this insurance. We also will be without insurance for 2 months if we do not secure insurance before October of 2022. We are still looking for other options of insurance.

Per Mary – maybe at next month's meeting we will have more bids on new insurance and we can poll our members. This insurance would start in December 2022.

George Robinson made a motion to the E Board members present to vote for the insurance thru WSCC through 2022. Vote taken – Six (6) E Board members voted yes. One (1) E Board member voted yes via email. For a total of 7 Board Members. It has passed that we will go with WSCC insurance.

A Vote was taken by the club members in attendance regarding the insurance. Vote taken – Thirteen (13) Agree & One (1) does not.

We will get back to WSCC and hopefully Helen Landis will get us a policy for the one (1) day for Legend's on Display Car Show.

Mary will also look into our own insurance for the event. Legend's on Display Car Show will be held on May 22, 2022.

As for now we are moving forward with May 22, 2022 Legend's on Display car show.

Helen Landis will send out an email blast of our flyer thru mail chimp once we have the flyer ready to go.

We are now partnered with Motorsports Reg. All car show entrants can register online for the upcoming car show.

We can also put a registration link on our website, so that people looking

into the car show can register for our event online in advance. We will also accept registration the day of the event via cash, or Credit Card via square.

Currently we have sponsorship interest from TPS. Edie Devine had been working with TPS. Edie has moved and has turned over all information over to Mary and Rob. Hopefully we can get TPS to sponsor us for the year.

We need to order all the trophies for the car show by April 14th. Our DJ is set

I have contacted Terry Thompson at Blackhawk museum and he will set up a tent for us just like he did in the past.

We will need VOLUNTEERS to help at this event. Please let us know if you will be attending and able to help out. Gene Peters will bring the trailer to the car show.

We will have a cutoff date for the online registration. Motor Sports Reg will give us a list of paid registrants.

Mary will need the rate page for the K advertising from Edie Devine. Mary will contact her for the information.

Current approximate costs for Legend's on Display are \$2000.00 for DJ, WSCC fee and Trophies.






