

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


NOVATO CHEVROLET

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AMERICA'S OLDEST CORVETTE CLUB

n July of 1956 in the East Bay, two Corvette owners, Johnny Zeh and Jerry Wright, waved & stopped to talk. Corvettes were few in numbers then & several weeks could pass before encountering another. These drivers discussed starting a Corvette Club.

By July 15, 1956, an informal meeting of Corvette owners decided to establish the Northern California Corvette Association. These early Corvette owners met frequently at each other's homes with their numbers increasing each month.

On March 28, 1957, an initial group of 35 met at Daily Chevrolet in Oakland to establish the by-laws. By then Josh Hogue, San Francisco Examiner's sports car event columnist suggested that this group combine with the one meeting at Les Vogel Chevrolet in San Francisco.

n May 9, 1957 NCCA was incorporated & 40 members elected Roy Storey President. Roy was a TV & radio sportscaster & Corvette participant in SCCA's regional races. Sandy Greenblat was elected Vice

President, Patty Gellenbeck, Secretary & John Zeh, Treasurer. The charter membership for NCCA was closed at the end of May 1957 listing 47 members.

President Roy Storey suggested a series of autocross events named after Grand Prix races. NCCA presented Northern California's 3rd autocross. 150 cars drove the course at the Milpitas Ford Plant. This series set the standard for autocrossing in Northern California. Though Roy Storey was soon transferred to Hollywood by CBS, he helped NCCA to properly start as a competing club.

CCA is still participating in autocrossing, drag races, track racing & car shows. The club is the oldest member of the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC), joining in 1966. We have evolved into more of a social club over the years with the focus on day & weekend trips. In recent years interest has increased in racing, with members taking trophies in drag racing and autocross and entering more and more open track days at Sonoma, Thunderhill, Weather-Tech Raceway at Laguna Seca and Button-willow race tracks.

CCA celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2007 by inviting past presidents to a dinner dance where we shared memorabilia. Our calendar is filled each January with events for the coming year that include trips to an assortment of locations, car shows, our annual fall banquet, & Christmas party.

he club's signature annual event, *Vette Magic*, has traditionally been a two-day, all Corvette Car Show & Drag Races. It is sponsored and organized by NCCA each summer. In 2015, for the first time, in a major break with tradition, Drag Races for the *40th Vette Magic* were opened to all "Bowtie" (Chevrolet) and then in 2016 for the 41st, to all GM sedans and sports cars. Each year this event draws a large number of Corvette racers and spectators from Northern California & the surrounding states.

CCA is a valuable member of our community, as we contribute to several charitable organizations each year through our charitable foundation.

General Business Meeting Minutes Shirley Smith, Secretary

Wednesday, July 6, 2022 7:00 pm at Harry's Hof Brau, San Leandro

Call meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Roll Call of Members - 16 in attendance.



President: Rob Andersen – Welcome members.

A motion was made to approve the minutes in last month's K and all approved.

We have no guests this evening. We have to cover a bunch of things this evening.

First is the passing of two of our club members.

Suzie Wells (wife of Jim Wells) passed away on Monday, July 4th. Bonnie Bourne (wife of Bruce Bourne) passed away on Tuesday, July 5th. Our deepest sympathy and prayers go out to Jim, Bruce and families. Jim Wells sent me some pictures to use in the K. George will up load pictures to media fire to also be used in the K. We will have a write up on both members.

We have now changed to NCCC for our insurance. All is done. They are very happy and leadership at NCCC is thrilled as we are the first club in Northern California that has joined them.

I talked to SCC and they are considering switching at the end of the year. I also talked to Rio Vista corvette club at Idol Beer Works run and they are going to be switching over too.

Other clubs are happy that we (NCCA) switched over first. I talked to DVC at their car show and I have forwarded all information on NCCC to them.

Moving forward, I have a promotion kit coming from NCCC. A show display Kit. Which includes a banner, table cloth with NCCC logo and brochures, etc. I am the Governor for our club for NCCC.

We will have full liability coverage. Events have to be listed in advance. We will send them a calendar of events in advance for coverage. I am happy we are doing this.

We are trying to get someone at NCCC to come to Vette Magic car show and he can then talk to everyone. This is a good move for us, positive for the club and we can start doing things again.

VP Events - Mary Coon -

MotorsportsReg is set up for Vette Magic pre-registration. If you are a NCCA club member and register in advance you will get \$5.00 discount on registration. There will be a special code you will use. If you have any questions, please contact Mary.

As of this morning we have 11 people pre-registered. Rob is sending emails out to the clubs. Mary posted our VM flyer on facebook.

We are going to move our registration and raffle tables to the middle of the car show parking area. This will put us in the middle of both parking lots.

We will pay Blue Moon DJ an additional fee to move to the middle of the parking lot area. He has to set up wires and trip covers. This will take an extra 1 ½ hours to set up. He will have speakers at both parking lots.

We will need to pay for the extra time for his set up.
We need to vote to pay for the extra fee for the DJ.
A motion was made by Rob Andersen and Seconded by Ken Coon to pay the extra fee. Motion was approved by a majority vote. (12 people)

We will close off the entrance with cones. We will have the entrants sign a waiver before they come into the show. Mary spoke with Terry at Blackhawk, he will have the cones out the night before the show to block off the old entrance.

Rob and I went to Dublin Trophy and looked at other ideas for our car show trophies. We are going with an acrylic trophy format. (We had 1 glass trophy break at our last car show.) We are going to use the C8 silhouette. Dublin Trophy is using this silhouette design exclusively for our club. (No other clubs can use the same trophy design.) Our regular awards will also be acrylic. This should save us money.

Other clubs are going with 1st and 2nd place trophies only. We could go to 1st and 2nd place too – we decided not to do this now, maybe 2023. We will wait to see how VM goes before deciding to make any changes.

Mary purchased a free standing 7.5 ft. tall flag style club banner for us to use at car shows and events.

Two trophies from Vette Magic had to be replaced. One was dropped by the participant and one had the wrong information printed on it. Both were replaced by Jeff at Dublin Trohpy and mailed out to the recipients.

Ken will reach out to TPS (our Sponsor) and see how many cars he will be bringing to the car show. We will save the old registration and raffle area for TPS to set up their canopy, cars and/or guests.

George has received deposits from TPS.

Mary will require clubs to arrive by 9:30am if they have more than 6 cars. All groups requiring group parking will need to show up at the same time.

We will have a separate waiver for everyone to sign.

We posted the waiver on Motorsports Reg.

I will send a letter to everyone that has pre-registered as they need to read the NCCC liability insurance waiver.

Mary to Rob – For NCCC – Blackhawk requires special wording on the insurance certificate. Rob has the wording and he will send to Mary and send an attachment to Joe the director of NCCC.

I am going to make up 50 goody bags for the first 50 people entering the show. I have a box of TPS bags in the club trailer. If someone can please get them before the next meeting so I can put them together in advance, please let me know. I have a \$5 promo discount from Safeway & bags; items from Rock Auto, and TPS flyer to add to the goody bags.

Mary will update Welcome letter for VM and send to Shirley to print.

General Account doing good. TPS sponsorship funds received.

Paid fee to State of California which they require us to do and I signed up online with them.

George Robinson- We need to change the procedures manual to cover the

new insurance etc. Mary Coon will work up the changes on the procedures manual and have at the next meeting and we will discuss at that time.

Mike at TPS at Legends on Display was very happy and excited for our next show

As part of the sponsorship package deal to TPS, Mike Mak is a member of our club – he will be an honorary member. Sponsorship (TPS) will pick a winner from the car show and present a trophy. (Sponsorship Award)

Ken Coon – I sent a list of the charities we have donated to in the past to Mike at TPS. If Mike wants to allocate funds to a special charity of his choice that is ok. At the end of year we will let Mike at TPS have his choice of a charitable organization that we can donate to.

Madeline & Hal Briar – We can drop Semper Fi. We have had 2 checks returned unable to deliver to this organization and have reached out with no response.

George Robinson – Grand Prize raffle – I suggested a car cover for a C8. The C6 car cover also fits a C7 and does not fit a C8. We are talking about purchasing a C7 car cover.

Ken Coon – Last car show, I was totally confused with 2 grand prizes. We had timeline complaints and people that complained that the raffle prizes were gone very quickly and then the grand prize numbers were called and we could not hear them all the way in the back of the parking area and the number was called ahead of time scheduled. Rob Andersen – We got the approval for 3 gift certificates from the Mexican restaurant at Blackhawk. They gave us a \$75 certificate, a \$50 certificate and a \$25 certificate.

Per Rob Andersen – We will add the \$75 certificate from the Mexican restaurant to the grand prize. The \$50 and \$25 certificates can be put into separate raffle bags as prizes alone.

We will have a grand prize raffle with tickets costing \$5 each. We will have Instant winner raffle prizes. No silent auction items this time. We will start to sell tickets for the raffles at 10:00 am. This will hopefully give everyone a better chance of purchasing raffle tickets before they are sold out within the first hour of the show.

Per Mary Coon – We might have to take people into the car show at 7:00 am. We will need to collect money if not paid in advance and have them sign a waiver.

If car clubs do not arrive together then they can't park together. Mary Coon will contact the car clubs to see how many cars they are planning to bring to the show. She will also notify them that they must be all together and arrive by 9:30 am in order to park together as a group.

Show starts at 8 am. Cut off for car clubs to come to the show together to park as a group is 9:30 am.

History & Origin of the Chinatown Car Weekend Car Show


Since Covid started to emerge itself in 2020 Chinatown SF was hammered by a string of events. First tourism and visitors plummeted by over 80% as people stayed away because they thought they would contract Covid by being near Chinese Americans. This was especially disheartening as in the Bay Area we tend to view ourselves as inclusive and most would not argue that within 50 miles of San Francisco is the most educated population in the United States. Unfortunately, that education didn't prevent people from staying away due to unfounded and false fear Chinese Americans would spread Covid-19 to them. This was a MAJOR problem as Chinatown SF depends on over 50% of it's revenue from outside visitors such as tourist. Then the next blow happened... the state of CA locked down the entire state for months decimating small businesses which depended on daily revenues to stay alive. Then came the social justice protest and riots which destroyed and looted Chinatown businesses which made a bad situation that much worse. And to make things even worse crimes against Asian/Chinese Americans EXPLODED in the Bay Area where we're at... especially against the elderly and women. The violence against the Asian community created MORE fear for visitors going to Chinatown and San Francisco which keep many people away.

Enough was enough... I couldn't sit back anymore and just watch the community which helped shape me be destroyed in front of my eyes. Chinatown SF has quietly existed in the USA for over 170 years and was crumbling before my eyes. On October 2nd & 3rd, 2021 we helped hold the largest car show in the history of Chinatown to help bring traffic and visitors back to Chinatown with the help of community leaders and various organizations. All proceeds for the event was donated to CMUASF to help merchants and the citizens of Chinatown SF. This event is born out of my desire to help give back to Chinatown SF which has given so much to me and helped shape who I am. I spent most of many summers with my brother with my Grandmother in Chinatown in a SRO (10x10 room) off Pacific Ave... we were poor but rich with life and love from our community. We feel it is our obligation to help since we have the means and I the platform to help drive support from our car community. The show was a major success with over 76 cars attending while 1000's of visitors descended onto Chinatown to support the event and small business. That weekend was one of the busiest weekends of 2021 for Chinatown small businesses.

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Message from Rob Andersen - President

NCCA Club Members,

I want to bring everyone up to speed about what has been happening with liability insurance coverage through WSCC. A few months ago there was an a fatality at a local autocross event held at the Cow Palace. A claim was made thru the Insurance company that WSCC carries and due to the severity of the claim, WSCC insurance was dropped. For months all clubs were told not to hold any car shows, runs, caravanning or even GBM.

WSCC continued to search for basic liability coverage with another insurance company. After a few months, they procured basic liability coverage with a new insurance company. This new insurance coverage does not cover autocross, car shows, runs, caravanning and any events like car runs to a restaurant. Any caravaning to a destination event we want to plan, will add an additional charge of \$200.00 per event, per day for liability insurance. For NCCA to pay \$200.00 to have the runs and car shows we have always had in the past is not financially possible anymore with WSCC. Sorry to say we have to leave WSCC.

I have been in contact with the NCCC VP of Membership, Stephen Johnson and he has sent me the cost breakdown and the liability coverage we will have with through their membership. I have been in contact with Joe Orrico who is the Executive of West Coast Region, which NCCA will join. The cost of Directors and Officers insurance (D&O) is all included with the membership cost. The first year membership is the same as the cost of WSCC. The great difference is the second year the cost drops by \$10.00. We will be saving money starting January 2023 and have all the liability coverage that we need to have our car shows, caravanning runs and all "Club Events."

NCCC Membership Fees:

Couples cost-\$45.00 first year/\$35.00 afterwards. Single cost-\$35.00 first year/\$25.00 afterwards. If a Single wants to add a member, the cost is \$10.00, then they are now a couple membership.

All "CLUB EVENTS '' must be on the NCCA calendar and submitted to the Executive of the West Coast Region one month ahead of time. Once that is done we are covered for liability when we caravan as a club to any club event. At our June GBM we presented the information with our Board Members and Club Members who attended the meeting. We had 16 who attended GBM. As a result I brought up two issues to vote for:

- 1- Vote to join NCCC and leave WSCC ASAP. This vote was unanimous - YES.
- 2- Vote that all current NCCA Club members who have already paid their membership dues to WSCC. NCCA to cover the membership fees for all active members on our roster for only the first year 2022. This vote was also unanimous-YES.

There will be no charge to any NCCA member for the first year 2022. WSCC has stated that they are not refunding any membership money to any clubs who decide to leave WSCC.

Final production statistics for the 2022 Corvette are now available for viewing. Of the 25,831 cars produced, 52.1% were coupes, while convertibles came in just under the halfway split at 47.9%. Torch Red was once again the most popular color choice for 2022.

The most popular performance package was the Z51 Performance Package selected for 68.6% of the 2022 model year Corvettes. Front Lift was chosen on 58.8% of the total model cars while option NPP Performance Exhaust came in at 86.9%. Carbon Flash was the most popular exterior stripe option and can be seen on 1,542 of the cars.
