

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

America's Oldest Corvette Club

n July of 1956 in the East Bay, two Corvette owners, Johnny Zeh and Jerry Wright, waved & stopped to talk. Corvettes were few in numbers then & several weeks could pass before encountering another. These drivers discussed starting a Corvette Club.

By July 15, 1956, an informal meeting of Corvette owners decided to establish the Northern California Corvette Association. These early Corvette owners met frequently at each other's homes with their numbers increasing each month.

On March 28, 1957, an initial group of 35 met at Daily Chevrolet in Oakland to establish the by-laws. By then Josh Hogue, San Francisco Examiner's sports car event columnist suggested that this group combine with the one meeting at Les Vogel Chevrolet in San Francisco.

n May 9, 1957 NCCA was incorporated & 40 members elected Roy Storey
President. Roy was a TV & radio sportscaster & Corvette participant in SCCA's regional races. Sandy Greenblat was elected Vice

President, Patty Gellenbeck, Secretary & John Zeh, Treasurer. The charter membership for NCCA was closed at the end of May 1957 listing 47 members.

President Roy Storey suggested a series of autocross events named after Grand Prix races. NCCA presented Northern California's 3rd autocross. 150 cars drove the course at the Milpitas Ford Plant. This series set the standard for autocrossing in Northern California. Though Roy Storey was soon transferred to Hollywood by CBS, he helped NCCA to properly start as a competing club.

CCA is still participating in autocrossing, drag races, track racing & car shows. The club is the oldest member of the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC), joining in 1966. We have evolved into more of a social club over the years with the focus on day & weekend trips. In recent years interest has increased in racing, with members taking trophies in drag racing and autocross and entering more and more open track days at Sonoma, Thunderhill, Weather-Tech Raceway at Laguna Seca and Button-willow race tracks.

CCA celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2007 by inviting past presidents to a dinner dance where we shared memorabilia. Our calendar is filled each January with events for the coming year that include trips to an assortment of locations, car shows, our annual fall banquet, & Christmas party.

he club's signature annual event, *Vette Magic*, has traditionally been a two-day, all Corvette Car Show & Drag Races. It is sponsored and organized by NCCA each summer. In 2015, for the first time, in a major break with tradition, Drag Races for the *40th Vette Magic* were opened to all "Bowtie" (Chevrolet) and then in 2016 for the 41st, to all GM sedans and sports cars. Each year this event draws a large number of Corvette racers and spectators from Northern California & the surrounding states.

CCA is a valuable member of our community, as we contribute to several charitable organizations each year through our charitable foundation.

History & Origin of the Chinatown Car Weekend Car Show

Since Covid started to emerge itself in 2020 Chinatown SF was hammered by a string of events. First tourism and visitors plummeted by over 80% as people stayed away because they thought they would contract Covid by being near Chinese Americans. This was especially disheartening as in the Bay Area we tend to view ourselves as inclusive and most would not argue that within 50 miles of San Francisco is the most educated population in the United States. Unfortunately, that education didn't prevent people from staying away due to unfounded and false fear Chinese Americans would spread Covid-19 to them. This was a MAJOR problem as Chinatown SF depends on over 50% of it's revenue from outside visitors such as tourist. Then the next blow happened... the state of CA locked down the entire state for months decimating small businesses which depended on daily revenues to stay alive. Then came the social justice protest and riots which destroyed and looted Chinatown businesses which made a bad situation that much worse. And to make things even worse crimes against Asian/Chinese Americans EXPLODED in the Bay Area where we're at... especially against the elderly and women. The violence against the Asian community created MORE fear for visitors going to Chinatown and San Francisco which keep many people away.

Enough was enough... I couldn't sit back anymore and just watch the community which helped shape me be destroyed in front of my eyes. Chinatown SF has quietly existed in the USA for over 170 years and was crumbling before my eyes. On October 2nd & 3rd, 2021 we helped hold the largest car show in the history of Chinatown to help bring traffic and visitors back to Chinatown with the help of community leaders and various organizations. All proceeds for the event was donated to CMUASF to help merchants and the citizens of Chinatown SF. This event is born out of my desire to help give back to Chinatown SF which has given so much to me and helped shape who I am. I spent most of many summers with my brother with my Grandmother in Chinatown in a SRO (10x10 room) off Pacific Ave... we were poor but rich with life and love from our community. We feel it is our obligation to help since we have the means and I the platform to help drive support from our car community. The show was a major success with over 76 cars attending while 1000's of visitors descended onto Chinatown to support the event and small business. That weekend was one of the busiest weekends of 2021 for Chinatown small businesses.

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

The new C8 Corvette is an amazing car with its new mid-engine format, traction control, and host of tech features. For the \$76K I paid for my 2LT car from Abel Chevrolet there is no better new performance car which can be purchased off a dealer show room floor. The great thing about new models of cars is there are new upgrades and mods which are available! I can't leave a car stock.

My car has a host of upgrades but today we're going to focus on the install of the Vertical Doors Lambo Door Kit. The "Lambo Doors" was made popular in the early 80's by the Lamborghini Countach. The install of the kit is VERY labor intensive and requires the entire front clip to be removed which includes the front fenders, bumper, and head lights. The process takes about 2-3 days and costs \$4599 for parts and labor. We offer lifetime warranty on the labor for the door kit if it ever needs adjustment. After the doors are installed, you can open them normally OR as a Lambo Door.

While the front bumper is off, I would HIGHLY recommend installing a set of our TPS C8 Radiator Screens. The C8 has 2 massive openings in the front of the bumper which is great for air flow to the radiator BUT the issue it creates is it leaves the radiator exposed to being damaged. Look at any stock C8 without radiator screens and you will see the car's radiator has damage to them. Our screens retail for \$299, have a lifetime warranty, made in the USA, and covers the entire radiators for protection compared to others on the market.

CORVETTES AT CARLISLE, August 25-27, 2022

Just imagine yourself going to the State Fair, anticipating the usual display of prize - winning animals, a complete assortment of foods on a stick and vendors of just about anything useful and not so useful. You'll even see close friends and your extended circle of friends.

But wait! Your trip to the State Fair has turned into the Fairgrounds in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. The two-mile drive off the Interstate to the Fairgrounds entrance has numerous Corvettes heading in the opposite direction and you see at least twenty Corvettes in your rearview mirror. As you park on the Show Field with your friends' cars near you or anywhere else on this sprawling, hilly spread of 20 acres, nothing but Corvettes from horizon to horizon: approximately 3,500 Corvettes. 2022 was the 40th Corvettes at Carlisle.


My trip to Corvettes at Carlisle this year marks probably my 15th trip since 1999. For the past ten years, I've spent most of my time there at the National Council of Corvettes hospitality tent. We provide information to Corvette people who pass by the tent letting them know about the benefits of NCCC, where to find an existing club, how to become an NCCC club, or Corvette club members from your own region stopping by to say "Hi."

As NCCC Vice-President-Membership, I get invited to be a Celebrity Judge and pick my favorite Corvette on the Show Field. There are about 1,500-2,000 cars entered in the Show Field display and I get to pick just one. My pick this year was a 2017 Grand Sport coupe from New York.

The NCCC tent this year was next to the National Corvette Museum store's tent and the NCM Insurance tent. Directly across from us was the Chevrolet display of the 70th Anniversary models. Within 200 paces either to the left or right of our tent was the Meguire's wax products tent, Adam's wax products tent and an exhaust system installation vendor. That particular exhaust system vendor every year offers FREE exhaust systems and installation to a select number of NCCC members. I was selected a few years ago for a free Borla system for my Torch Red C5 but could not get there on the specified date.

Chevrolet had C8 designers, engineers, support staff and even some of the C8R drivers on hand to give seminar and to mingle with attendees. There were Z06s to drool over

and sit in at their tent and even a cutaway C8 and cutaway Z06 engine. I had the opportunity to talk with Tadge Juechter, chief

I parked one row over from the fleet of about ten 2023 Z06s that Chevrolet had brought to Carlisle. They attracted a fair amount of attention but were parked in the VIP parking area. What a thrill be just one row away from them. I did briefly park next to three of the Z06s as I wanted to get a picture of my car next to theirs.

The hundreds of vendors there ranged from discount tires, nationally known Corvette parts vendors, restoration and upgrade vendors, body kits, specialty wheels, and just about every kind of food you can put on a stick or on a bun. New parts, rusty parts, tie downs or dreamcatchers; it's all there. You might even talk with Lancer Miller, co-owner of Corvettes at Carlisle!!!

There are about 100 clubs present with their members and club tents. Canadian clubs, East Coast clubs and even some from the Carolinas. One of the evenings there is a Corvette cruise through downtown Carlisle. If you get worn out the first day of looking at Corvettes, you have two more days to see every generation of the Corvette. But don't miss the concours judged show that is hosted by York County Corvette Club, an NCCC club in the East Region. Stock, Custom, modified; several categories of judging are available for you to enter.

Reinventing The Wheel

August 18, 2022

After sketches are drawn, images rendered, printed, sculpted, modified, scanned, evaluated, and refined, each part of your car becomes a three-dimensional "document" called a Design Quality Prove Out Model. For this month's artifact of the month, we will look at one of the wheels in our collection that will be


featured in our upcoming exhibition, Driven by Design.

The wheels are important in the overall look of a car, but they obviously also perform a serious function. Designers need to find balance between creating something that appeals to people aesthetically and that is structurally sound. Retired Design Director of Performance Vehicles, Tom Peters, shares, "We might have to be taking surfaces away here and there to reduce the mass, thinking about being able to fit tools, clear the brakes, fit the tires, wheel weights. These are incredibly complex. All that must be evaluated."

It may go back and forth a few times until both engineers and the designers are happy. They will then create a model like this one on the REN Board. This is a dense material that can be cut accurately to give a perfect three-dimensional representation of a part before files are used to make the actual tooling for the production parts.

This one appears to be autographed. That is not exactly the case. These are the signatures of those signing off on the model as "ready to release from design" and move on to production. "It's a document now," Tom says, "It is an understanding and an agreement between disciplines—engineering, design, and manufacturing."
