GENERAL MEETING MINUTES - June 6, 1972

The meeting was called to order by Vice-President DAVE PYGEORGE at 8:27 PM. President JERRY LOCKWOOD was absent due to working nights.

There were 23 members and guests present. NANCY LOCKWOOD, Acting Membership Chairman, introduced the guests. Minutes were approved as printed in the Kaleidoscope.

Treasurer's Report - JOHN MAH gave the balance in the treasury and explained there were no outstanding bills. NANCY LOCKWOOD stated that beer was still available and would be used for Captain Weber Day. She explained that some was used for the Tricycle party. ROGER BOAZ announced that he had a list of numerous things that he would submit a bill for. John asked Roger to make a list and have three club members sign the bill and Roger will be reimbursed. NANCY LOCKWOOD asked John if he had a breakdown of the June 4th Autocross. John stated that so far it was incomplete. Expenditures and trophies were discussed. SOMETHING FOR THE LADIES: MOTHER'S COOKBOOK (Circa 1914)

Keeping eggs fresh - Eggs may be kept for a year in the following manner: To a pail of water, put in unslacked lime and coarse salt - each a pint. Keep it in a cellar, or cool place, and put the eggs in, as fresh laid as possible. It is well to keep a stone pot of this lime water ready to receive the eggs as soon as laid; make a fresh supply every few months. This lime water is of exactly the proper strength; strong lime water will cook the eggs. Very strong lime water will eat the shell.
